11.	Recruitment of Vicar	The wardens were delighted to share that we have been allocated a .5 share in a vicar. Our parish share should be adjusted accordingly. Asa Humphreys, the Parish Development Officer, will support the creation of our Parish Profile. This will be shared with the PCC by the end of December ahead of a number of meetings leading to interview and appointment, hopefully by Easter 2024. CLB emphasised the importance of prayer. We have been exploring different ways to pray that encourage a range of participation. Two members of the PCC will be appointed to the interview panel.

15.	Inclusive Church	AMH shared insight into a book she is reading about us all being followers of Christ. CLB and others advocated for Inclusive Church and a balanced discussion took place. A voluntary donation is requested by the charity Inclusive Church and useful resources are supplied, including speakers if required. CB proposed the resolution 'We believe in inclusive Church – a church which celebrates and affirms every person and does not discriminate. We will continue to challenge the church where it continues to discriminate against people on the grounds of disability, economic power, ethnicity, gender, gender identity, learning disability, mental health, neurodiversity, or sexuality. We believe in Church which welcomes and serves all people in the name of Jesus Christ; which is scripturally faithful; which seeks to proclaim the Gospel afresh for each generation; and which, in the power of the Holy Spirit, allows all people to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Jesus Christ.' DR seconded and a vote took place. JC, DRH, CW felt being inclusive did not need an official agreement. Five voted for; three against, two absent. This majority vote means that CB will progress the paperwork for becoming an Inclusive Church and the church family will be kept updated about progress.	СВ
